As well as working hard to produce food for your table, this farm promotes Scottish wildlife.

We are proud of the diversity and abundance of animals on our farm.

Like you, we enjoy seeing foxes and stoats out controlling mice, while hares, deer, and other grazing species keep the margins of our fields in trim. We have a healthy population of barn owls, falcons, and hawks. Song birds are thriving in the absence of Grey squirrels. Our natural wildlife is in good balance.





We thank the community around us for your support, and appreciate how well you follow the Scottish Access Code, keeping your dogs on leads and walks to the paths. We strive to have a litter free farm and appreciate the help you give us in keeping our environment beautiful.

We maintain our wildlife population near the maximum sustainable density this farm can support before crops are damaged. Where problem, sick or injured animals have to be removed, this done by our Conservation Manager after careful planning, written review and identification of the individual animals. If you see our Conservation Manager at work you are welcome to ask about the wildlife, or ask for his ID which you can check by emailing us.



Cellular trail cams and CCTV are in use to monitor wildlife and maintain a safe environment by providing evidence of unauthorised hunting or fly tipping to the police. We also patrol at night with thermal imaging and night vision. We appreciate your vigilance reporting crime when it occurs.

We do not hunt or shoot foxes or hares on this farm, and anyone who does is committing the serious crimes of armed trespass and poaching. Chasing any wild animal in Scotland using dogs is an arrestable crime. Please report any suspicious activity by calling the police and send photos to security@conservation.scot.
